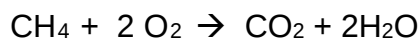


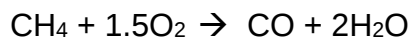

Alkanes – with O₂

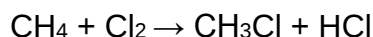
Complete combustion



Incomplete combustion

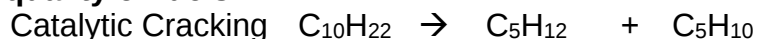


Alkanes – with Cl₂, UV



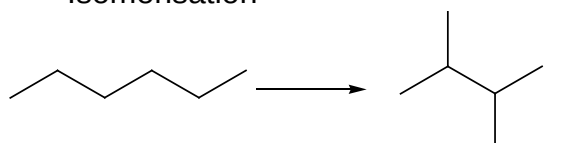
Mechanism = Photochemical free radical substitution.

Alkanes – improving the quality of fuels



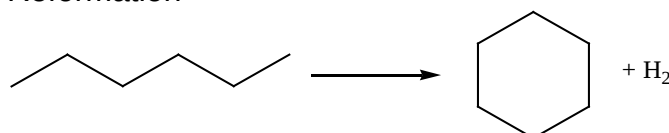
Conditions – Heat (600°C), Al₂O₃

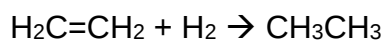
Conditions - Heat, Pt

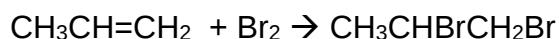

Conditions - Heat, Ni

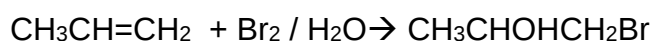
Alkenes – with Br₂ / hexane

Alkenes – with HBr/dry/gas

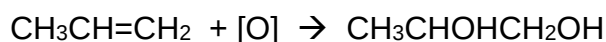


Major product

Mechanism = Electrophilic Addition

Explanation for major product = Secondary carbocationic intermediate is more stable than primary.
